- Up until around 2020 Area 11 had similar structure to SENY
 - o 1400 groups vs. 2000 groups
 - o A11 District Chairperson (did not have vote at Area) = A49 DCMC
 - o A11 Super District = A49 Counties
 - o A11 Subdistricts = A49 District
 - o The change to the new structure was gradual
- Prior to 2020 A11 had 9 geographical Districts and 1 Linguistic District (120-250 groups/district)
 - Now has 35 or 36 districts (15-40 groups/district)
- Conversation about redistricting Area 11 started in 2007
 - o it came up repeatedly in the Area
 - o at that time, Area wasn't interested
 - Obstacles: fear, resistance to change
- 2017-18 ad hoc committee was appointed to investigate redistricting
 - o Area Did not take it up
 - o In 2020, 1 district redisticted. Others followed. Some did not
- Problems with the old structure:
 - o GSRs often had double roles (GSR & District Committee Chair)*
 - o Sharing Leadership (District Chair + DCM) muddied the waters
 - No clear leadership roles
 - Too many cooks spoil the broth
 - DCMs had no accountability (they were not directly responsible to the groups they served)
 - DCMs were not able to serve in true leadership capacity
 - Too many meetings in some parts of Area 11
 - Matt warned against top-heavy bureaucracies
- Benefits of the new structure
 - o Increased engagement by GSRs and DCMs
 - While it's too soon to measure an increase in numbers, the quality of GSR participation at the Area has increased
 - o GSRs show up to assemblies informed and prepared to participate
